CATEGORY 1 30 points each – choose 1	CATEGORY 2 15 points each – choose 2	CATEGORY 3 10 points each – choose 3
Explain how you would make your book into a movie. Consider casting, setting, important scenes, etc. (1 page minimum)	Pretend you are the author. Describe the parts of the book that were the hardest AND the ones that were the most fun to write. Explain why. (3-5 paragraphs)	Discuss how a main character is like or unlike a person you know. (3-5 paragraphs)
Find 3 songs that relate to your book. Print the lyrics and explain the relationships between each song and the book. (1 paragraph per song)	Explain how a character changed from the beginning to the end of the book. (3-5 paragraphs)	Describe an experience that you have had that is similar to a character in the book. (3-5 paragraphs)
Make a scrapbook of hand-drawn pictures for the main characters. Include a one-paragraph description of each character.	What problems did the major characters have, and how were they resolved? (3-5 paragraphs)	Create and illustrate a timeline sequencing the main events of the book.
Make a video that reflects the setting, plot, major characters, and conflict of your book. (5 minutes max)	Create 3 pieces of art about the book—1 for setting, 1 for conflict, and 1 for mood.	Create a collage representing the plot of the book. (Printed pictures acceptable)
	Create a newspaper front page for your book.	Design a book jacket for your book, including a 3-5 paragraph summary.

For the final 10 points, keep a vocabulary journal. List words that are unfamiliar to you as you encounter them along with their definitions.
